Wildland COURSES

S212 – Wildland Fire Chainsaws

This is an instructor-led course intended to be presented at the local level. The course lessons provide introduction to the function, maintenance and use of internal combustion engine powered chainsaws, and their tactical wildland fire application. Field exercises support entry level training for firefighters with little or no previous experience in operating a chainsaw, providing hands-on cutting experience in surroundings similar to fireline situations.

Objectives:

- Define and apply chainsaw safety standards as required by OSHA and agency handbooks, manuals, directives, and owner's manuals.
- Identify and demonstrate basic chainsaw operation, troubleshooting, maintenance, and safety features.
- Demonstrate the tactical application of chainsaws in fireline construction and mop up operations.

PREREQUISITE QUALIFICATION/TRAINING:

Qualified as Firefighter Type 2 (FFT2)

RT-130, Wildland Fire Safety Annual Refresher Training

The intent of RT-130, Wildland Fire Safety Training Annual Refresher (WFSTAR) is to focus line-going personnel on operations and decision-making issues related to fireline safety in order to recognize and mitigate risk, maintain safe and effective practices, and reduce accidents and near misses. This refresher course will cover the required topics to qualify for your annual refresher. Topics include: Communication, Fire Shelters, Entrapment Avoidance, and Current Issues. You will be required to practice a fire shelter deployment so please dress appropriately.

PREREQUISITE QUALIFICATION/TRAINING: It is required for designated positions in order to maintain currency, for all personnel assigned to positions with fireline duties, and for any position assigned to the fireline for non-suppression tasks.

S131 – Firefighter Type 1 (needed for the FFT1/ICT5 task book)

This is a 12-hour course designed to meet the training needs of the Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1) and/or Incident Commander Type 5 (ICT5). This course is designed to be interactive in nature. It contains class discussion and several tactical decision games designed to facilitate learning the objectives. Topics include operational leadership, communications, LCES, and tactical decision – making. Objectives:

- Identify position responsibilities and demonstrate the ability to apply principles of Operational Leadership found in the

Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG).

- Describe how to incorporate and maintain open lines of communication with appropriate personnel.
- Identify Look Up, Look Down and Around indicators, and demonstrate the ability to apply the components of Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones (LCES) as described in the IRPG.
- Demonstrate the ability to apply tactical decision-making procedures.

PREREQUISITE QUALIFICATION/TRAINING: Qualified as Firefighter Type 2 (FFT2)

PRE-WORK REQUIREMENT: None

MAXIMUM ATTENDEES: 20

S230/231 – Crew/Engine Boss (needed for the single resource boss task book)

This course was developed using a blended approach to learning. Students are required to complete the online training portion of the course and pass an online assessment prior to taking the instructor-led training (ILT). The focus of this online training is to teach knowledge and concepts. The ILT will reinforce the content learned online and provide opportunities to apply this knowledge to real-world scenarios and practical exercises. Upon completion of the ILT, students must then take and pass a final assessment in order to receive credit for the course. The final assessment covers content from both the online and ILT portions of the course.

Objectives:

- Describe the Crew Boss responsibilities prior to and during mobilization on the incident and during demobilization.
- Perform the tasks of an Engine Boss in making the tactical decisions required to safely manage an engine and personnel on an incident.
- Identify the hazards and risks on various incidents and describe how to mitigate them.
- Describe tactics appropriate to various wildland fire situations and implementation through the chain of command.

PREREQUISITE QUALIFICATION/TRAINING:

S230 - Qualified as Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1) and successful completion of S290, Intermediate Wildland Fire Behavior

S231 – Must have successfully passed S230 – Crew Boss prior

PRE-WORK REQUIREMENT:

There is MANDATORY pre-work due for this class. Certificates of completion for both S230/S231 need to be brought to the first day of class. Failure to do so will result in an automatic failure and the class will not count for credit. This pre-work will take you multiple days; do not wait until the last minute! To complete this pre-work you will need a Wildland Fire Learning Portal account.

Structure COURSE

Vehicle Extrication Course - Saturday

This one-day course introduces the proper methods of safely extricating patients from automobiles that have been involved in various types of accidents and features a combination of classroom and field exercises.

Discussion and Learning topics include:

- New vehicle construction
- Supplemental restraints system
- Accident scene evaluation
- Vehicle stabilization
- Patient care
- Hand tool operations

Instructor: Keith Trojanowski, Captain with the Rapid City Fire Department, is currently assigned to Fire Station 3, RCFD's Light Rescue Station. His 19 years with Rapid City Fire Department and 14 years working at our light rescue station have positioned him with the knowledge and skill to share with others through this course.

PREREQUISITE QUALIFICATION/TRAINING: None

REQUIRED PPE (BRING YOUR OWN): Rescue Gear or Bunker Gear that includes, Coat/Pants/Boots/Helmet/Gloves/Eye Protection.

EMT Refresher

An EMT refresher is a course aimed at qualified EMTs or people with recently lapsed EMT qualifications which is designed to provide students with a refresher on basic medical topics relevant to practice as an emergency medical technician, paramedic, or first responder.

Law Enforcement Disability Awareness Train the Trainer (LE Only)

This 2-day training, developed with input from law enforcement from Virginia, South Dakota, Missouri and New York, both sensitizes and educates law enforcement on how to effectively identify, address, and respond to various disabilities they will encounter in their line of duty. This is the nation's only comprehensive disability awareness training for law enforcement. The train the trainer program option is developed strictly for law enforcement personnel with the intent to train other law enforcement officers.

All Hazards COURSES

Active Attack Integrated Response Train-the-Trainer

This 5-day performance level direct delivery course designed to improve integration between **law enforcement, fire, tele-communicator and emergency medical services (EMS) in active attack / shooter events.**

The course provides law enforcement officers with key medical skills based on tactical emergency casualty care (TECC) guidelines, which can be used at the point of injury (POI) to increase survivability of victims. The course also provides a model framework for law enforcement, fire, and EMS to integrate responses during an active attack / shooter event through the rescue task force concept. This course has been designed to improve the safety and survivability of victims of active attack / shooter events and increase the effectiveness, coordination, and resource integration between law enforcement, fire, tele-communications and EMS when responding to these events.

Nuclear Convoys Briefing

This 4-hour program, brought to you by the US Dept. of Energy Office of Secure Transportation OST's liaison program, communicates with law enforcement and public safety agencies nationwide, creating awareness of the OST mission (provide safe and secure transportation of nuclear weapons and components and special nuclear materials). This information helps to assist first responders during an OST emergency and provides direction for working with Federal agents during such an event. A post briefing Q&A session is included in the session. Attendees must be active first responders or supervisors/managers of a public safety agency. E/L0105 Public Information Basics

This 3-day course, normally offered only at Emergency Management Institute, brings highly trained professionals discussing the differences with PIO work in the response field. To equip participants with the skills needed to be work on the fly as a PIO, or those who are full or part-time PIOs, including oral and written communications; understanding and working with the media; and basic tools and techniques to perform effectively as a PIO, both in the proactive/advocacy times and crisis/emergency response. This for EM's and upper level response personnel from state, local, tribal, territorial response agencies who could find themselves talking to the media

Lead Instructor: Pat Gerdes has 36 years in Fire/EMS, 15 years as Director of EM in a 5-county area of Nebraska where he managed 22 declared disasters in that time. He is an Advanced Certified EM in Nebraska and South Dakota as well as a certified EM in Wyoming. He is a graduate of the National Emergency Management Basic Academy as well and serves as an Assistant Fire Chief at Piedmont Fire in the northern Black Hills. Support Instructor: Collin Baldacci, is a firefighter from Evansville WY for the last 3 years. He has a real passion for crisis communication after working as PIO for several industries and as a reporter for an online athletic website. He is heavily involved in Search and Rescue in Natrona County where he aids in the delivery of public information and formerly was in a similar role in healthcare in Casper, WY. He is also an ICS and a Basic PIO Instructor.
